Political map

Political maps are designed to show governmental boundaries of countries, states, and counties, the location of major cities, and they usually include significant bodies of water. Like the sample above, differing colours are often used to help the user differentiate between nations.

Physical map

Physical maps are designed to show landforms like deserts, mountains and plains.

A time zone is a region of the globe that observes a uniform standard time for legal, commercial, and social purposes. Time zones tend to follow the boundaries of countries and their subdivisions because it is convenient for areas in close commercial or other communication to keep the same time.









During which month does Beijing have the lowest average temperature?













In the United States, the government branch that interprets the Constitution and shapes the law is the _____ branch.








An archaeologist is one who carefully uncovers evidence from the past.






